A very secret war: Bugging the Nazis

During WW2, British intelligence bugged the conversations of thousands of German prisoners-of-war at three stately houses: Latimer House and Wilton Park in Buckinghamshire, and Trent Park in north London. Hitler's Generals, captured on the battlefields, were housed in luxurious conditions and lulled into a false sense of security. They relaxed and became unguarded in their conversations, little realising the house was 'wired for sound'. They inadvertently gave away from of Hitler's most closely guarded secrets.

For over 60 years the secret listeners never spoke about their work, not even to their families. They died, little knowing that they, alongside Bletchley Park, not only shortened the war but helped toward the victory on VE Day. Helen has researched and written about it for the first time.
