Rosemary Rumana and Lynda Bolton will be bringing the supplies.



MEMBERSHIP REVIEW: 20 SEPTEMBER 2023 – from Andrew Morgan

Current membership is 383, down from 434.


19 members have resigned usually due to health reasons or moving out of the area. 32 members have let their membership lapse. We have welcomed 12 new members during August and the first half of September.

136 (35.5%) re-joined by signing up to the Member Portal and using PayPal either using their PayPal account or their debit/credit card as a PayPal guest (you don't have to have a PayPal account to renew this way). 84 (21%) used BACS. 163 (42.5%) paid by cheque (134) or cash (29).

It is really encouraging that over half (56.5%) of the membership paid their subscription electronically. This really does ease the burden for the treasurer and membership secretary.
