
Thinking Out Loud




Introduction

What a great songwriter Ed Sheeran is—and his performance on this recording is superb. I have a full run-through of this song on my website, but it works really well in this simplified version too.



The first thing to tackle is the D/F#, which Ed plays by re-fretting, leaving finger 3 down from the D chord and moving fingers 1 and 2. The G is played using only fingers 2 and 3 and the A is played as a mini barre. The other tricky chord is the Bm. This is played as kind if 'half-barre' chord, which I've displayed for you. Have a go at playing it, and if you find it really hard I've written out an alternative chord (Bm7) that will work until you're ready for the proper Bm.





While it's possible to strum this song, it's much better suited to fingerstyle playing. There are also some nice percussive hits, which will bring another dimension to your playing. Turn over for a few examples of fingerstyle playing for this song.




Oh, baby, we found love right where we are. And we found love right where we are.



Start with the pattern below—this is the main groove and you should get really comfortable with it before adding any embellishments:



Use your fingers to pick the strings and hit all your fingers into the strings to get the percussive hit. There are a couple of optional embellishments to the guitar part, including 'hammer-ons', where you hammer down a finger without picking the note again—see the TAB below.



The only other slightly sticky bit is where the chords change quickly at the end of the chorus—I've written them out below with the rhythm count, as usual. Start by practising this slowly and really get comfortable with it before working up to full speed.
