Amberley Heritage Museum 30th August 2018

Our visit to Amberley Museum brought to life the industrial and transport heritage of Sussex as we explored the exhibits dating back to the 19th century. The site covers 36 acres with over 40 buildings, it was once a busy chalk quarry and Limeworks. Buildings and kilns are preserved alongside others rescued and erected there to display and house the exhibits which include:-

A narrow gauge railway provided free transport to explore the site, offering many opportunities to get up close to commercial vehicles, rail and road steam engines.

Age-old skills are kept alive by craftspeople and volunteers working to traditional methods. Woodturners, potters, stained glass maker, blacksmith, stick makers, wheelwrights, printers and greenwood workers are all based there.
